Post Confirmation:

Attending Mass weekly and regularly receiving such blessings as Reconciliation and the Holy Eucharist, further feeds a Catholic's spiritual life.

Talking daily with God, praying the Rosary and participating in novenas and charitable acts can also serve as other means that can encourage one's lifelong pursuit of salvation.

This journey is only the beginning and can offer continued blessings, hope and promise. Confirmed Christians, share more completely in the mission of Jesus Christ to live a Christian life. It means that we are not just receivers, but we become doers of the Word of God. But doing that, would be quite difficult at times, and in our Confirmation, we were given the right tools to help us in our journey of faith, which are the seven gifts of the Holy Spirit: wisdom, understanding, knowledge, counsel, fortitude, piety, and fear of the Lord.

We will be presenting to you post Confirmation experiences for you to join. You do not have to attend all of them, but the commitment you make at Confirmation is to continue growing in faith, so an honest effort to attend some is expected. As the old saying goes, "Confirmation is not graduation from Church."
